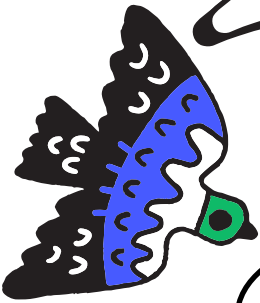

# HATFIELD FUTURES, PRESENTED BY OREGON'S KITCHEN TABLE

Using the year 2050 to spark our collective imagination, the Hatfield Futures Project invites up to six teams of high school students to shape Oregon's future by generating proposals to address important social, environmental, and economic issues. Teams from across the state came together for an in-person Camp on March 1-3 to learn about futurism and develop their ideas. They met with their Project Guides online to develop their proposals and then presented to community leaders, elected officials, and each other at the Hatfield Futures Showcase at Portland State University on March 23, 2024.

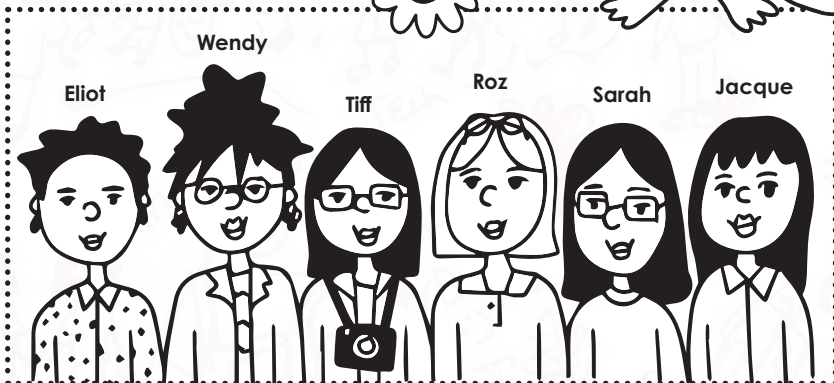
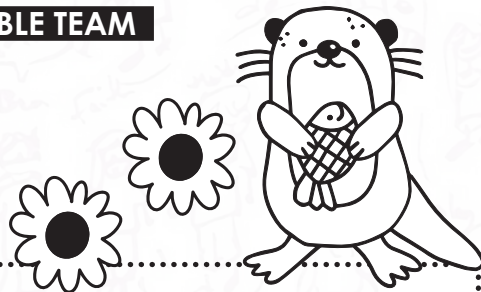

- Donation of supplies

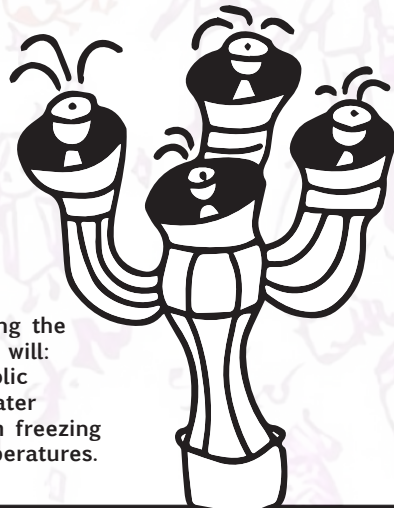
Ex: Water bottles,,

Constantly running the Benson Bubblers will:

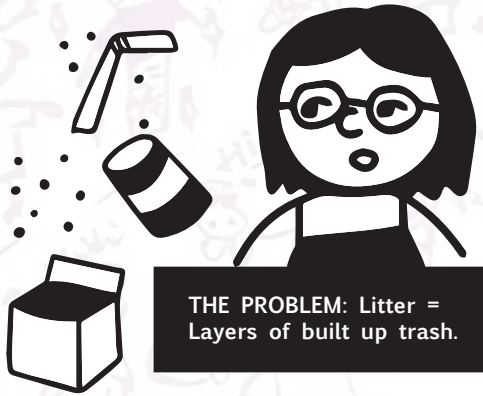
- Increase public access to water

50% of plastic is discarded after a single use.  
5% of plastic is actually ever recycled.  
And the other 95% remain in landfills or in general ecosystems.

## OUR IDEA? A.I.R.R

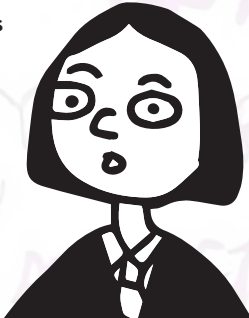
- **ALTERNATIVES:** Make plastic alternatives easier to create & buy!
- **INFLATE:** Increase the cost of plastic production > companies urged to switch.
- **RELEARN:** Utilize social media, celebrities, etc. to shift the norms.
- **RESTART:** Begin again; dispose of plastic use.

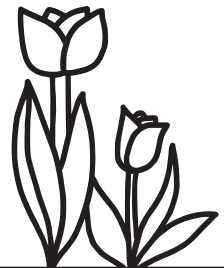
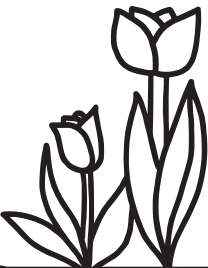

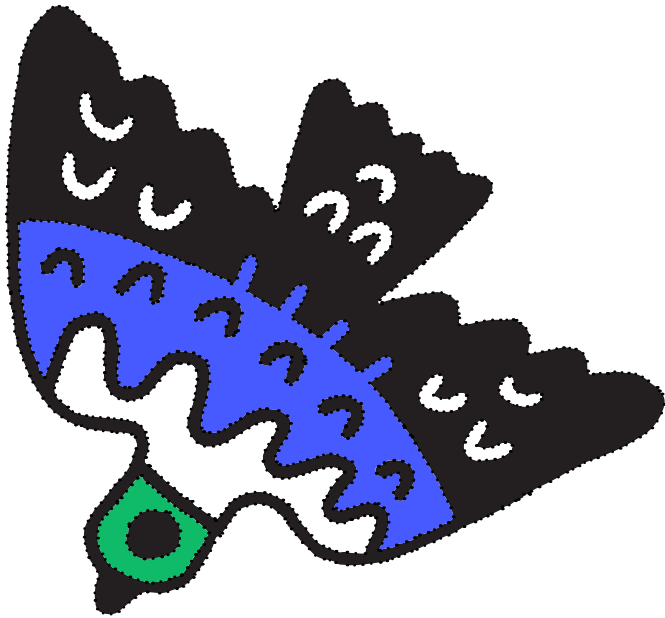
